Take your time getting this shape right, so it looks like the image. Step 2 Using the oval shape as a guide, draw the head outline, which is pear shaped. Then draw a single arced line in the middle of the head. After this, draw a wavy line to show the eye socket. See image on the left. Step 3 Draw two lines that form the body. The first line in the middle of the second bend in the body. See image on the left. Draw a second line for the body from the right side, at the base of the head and follow the guide curve up and stop in the most in the body. See image for reference. Step 4 Now continue the left side of the body up and around to the point of the tail. Then continue the line for the tail as we continue the line for the body curve. Then draw two lines out either side to create a 'V' shape. This creates our forked snake tongue. Step 6 And we are complete! From here you can draw some lines on the body to create some scale patterns and even draw a spiral cylinder shape on the tail to turn your snake into a rattlesnake. Have fun! This line storps about half way along the oval shape, then continues straight down to the bottom tip of the lower jaw. For the eye, draw a circle in the eye socket at the top of the oval shape. For the body we'll draw two lines. The first starts at the lower jaw and follows the 'S' guide line downwards. Refer to reference image. Step 4 It's time to add the fangs. Draw a sharp curved fang just below the eye for the pupil, and draw a small arc just above the eye to make the eye ridge. Finally, draw a line for the inside of the mouth. See reference image for placement. Step 5 That's it, we are now complete. Feel free to draw your own scales around the body and add your own tongue. They range in size from less than 4 inches (10 centimeters) to more than 30 feet (9 meters). There is even an ancient, fossilized snake that would have been 50 feet (15 meters) long. Snakes live on every continent in the world, except for snowy Antarctica. Snakes often get a bad rap, due in part to the venomous bite of some, or due to the fact that as reptiles, they are naturally cold blooded. Some people avoid snakes because they have been used as a symbol of evil since ancient times. Step 7: Draw random circles all over the body depicting the patches of this snake is ready. How to draw snake head step by step: Almost every snake has a similar type of head and if you want to draw a realistic snake's head just go with the explanation. Starting from the bottom of the head, draw a line inside the body until you get around three-guarters of the way along the body. Once you have it looking as it does in the picture, you're ready for the next step. Step 5 - Now, draw in some face details Your snake drawing needs some personality, so let's add facial details in this image to give it some! We will be adding a few details in this step. The main one will be some big pupils for the eyes. You could also change the look of the eyes to change the facial expression. We will then use some curved lines to give the face some nostrils, and then finally draw in a forked tongue coming out of the mouth. Step 6 - Add some finishing touches For step 6 of our guide on how to draw a snake, we shall add in some last details before moving on to the coloring stage. The main details will be on the belly of your snake. Draw some horizontal lines all along the belly section that you drew in earlier. Then you can add in some last, final details on the body of the snake. You can make this crosshatching mark by drawing four lines intersecting with each other. They will look a bit like the pattern you would play tic tac toe in. This mark can help to give some scaly texture to your snake drawing. Step 7 - Finish off your snake drawing with some color At the seventh and final step, you have learned how to draw a snake! You should already be proud of the awesome drawing. Now you get to stretch your creative muscles a bit by adding in some beautiful colors for your snake drawing. We used green and yellow as the main colors in our example drawing.
