A few things are constant on Bravo’s hugely popular Real Housewives reality shows: bitter fights, excessive alcohol consumption, and luxurious wealth. The latter is at least as much a strategic appearance as it is a financial fact for many of the stars. Some have been dealt serious blows to their investment portfolios, as when the housing crisis memorably hit the women of The Real Housewives of Orange County, the franchise’s original program. But others, from Beverly Hills’ unapologetically extravagant Lisa Vanderpump to Atlanta’s legendary musician member Kandi Burruss, have the assets and bank statements to back up their swagger. We should note: any “net worth site” should be taken with a grain of salt, but using them we can get a picture of who are the richest housewives on each installment, ranked from the the richest to the merely rich. The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills: Lisa Vanderpump Estimated net worth: \$75 million The stars of RHOBH are not shy about flaunting their wealth. They do so in ways that make other casts in the franchise look downright humble. That’s especially true of Lisa Vanderpump, who reportedly has the highest net worth of all the current U.S. Housewives stars and has seemed indomitable over all eight seasons of the Beverly Hills show. Though castmates like Kyle Richards and Erika Jayne are doing more than well for themselves, Vanderpump rules over an opulent mansion with everything one could imagine (there was that time she even bought two miniature horses for her backyard and made it seem almost kind of normal). Together with her husband Ken Todd, she runs an enviable restaurant empire, including the Los Angeles hotspots SUR, Pump, and Villa Blanca, all of which get plenty of publicity on RHOBH. In addition to a reported salary of \$500,000 per season of that show, her business is the center of the Bravo spinoff Vanderpump Rules, following her absurdly dramatic serving staff, for which she serves as an executive producer. The perpetually calm Vanderpump, meanwhile, is taking it all the way to the bank. The Real Housewives of New York City: Carole Radziwill Estimated net worth: \$50 million Journalist may not seem like the most likely career for a Real Housewife, but RHONY’s Radziwill has received numerous accolades over a long career in broadcast news. She worked as a producer at ABC News and even won a Peabody for her work, which included being stationed in Iraq during the Gulf War. She also married a man of nobility, Prince Anthony Radziwill, which certainly accounts for her stunning net worth. Sadly, he died in 1999, an event she has written about in bestselling books including the memoir What Remains. The Real Housewives of Atlanta: Kandi Burruss Estimated net worth: \$35 million Even if you don’t recognize Burruss, you know her work. The singer-songwriter is a member of the popular R&B group Xscape, and was one of the songwriters credited on TLC’s massive hit “No Scrubs.” The Grammy winner has had no problem finding success in her music career, but she’s also pulling in a reported \$450,000 per season of RHOA, which she joined in the second season. The label triple threat doesn’t even do her justice. The Real Housewives of Orange County: Shannon Beador Estimated net worth: \$20 million Beador may be the butt of some jokes on RHOC thanks to her New Agey personality and intense dedication to alternative medicine, but she has plenty of money to burn on her odd hobbies. Having joined the show during the ninth season, she’s had public ups and downs with her husband, David Beador, the owner of a successful construction company. They announced a separation at the end of 2017, but it’s unclear if they’ve finalized a divorce. Even if they do, it’s clear she’ll still make out okay, as Beador’s company reportedly pulls in more than \$20 million in annual revenue. The Real Housewives of Dallas: Stephanie Hollman Estimated net worth: \$18 million The other rookie in the Real Housewives lineup is RHOD, but its stars reported net worths can hold their own against the other entries. Born in a small town in Oklahoma, Hollman now reigns queen in Dallas, at least on this show. Her husband Travis owns and operates the Hollman locker company, which has been in his family since 1976 and counts among its clients the Chicago Cubs, the Los Angeles Lakers, the Dallas Mavericks, American Express, Facebook, and SoulCycle. The Real Housewives of New Jersey: Teresa Giudice Estimated net worth: \$11 million Giudice has been present through all eight seasons of RHONJ, despite having a bumpy road. She spent nearly a year in prison for a fraud conviction and was released in 2015. But she had already proved her perseverance. During her run on the show, she’s become a New York Times bestselling author with cookbooks inspired by her Italian heritage, including Skinny Italian and Fabulicious!. Between her publishing career and being a media personality, along with other sources of income, she’s beat out her castmates to reach eight figures. The Real Housewives of Potomac: Karen Huger Estimated net worth: \$10 million One of the new entries in the ever-expanding Real Housewives universe, RHOP’s stars may not be as famous as their counterparts, but one at least has pulled in serious cash. Huger’s husband Raymond is a software executive, whom she’s referred to as “the black Bill Gates.” But it’s not all necessarily rosy for the couple, as Raymond and his company reportedly owe millions in back taxes. Subscribe to We Should Talk here.Melissa Gorga knows a great season of Real Housewives when she sees one.The Real Housewives of New Jersey veteran, who has been on the franchise for nine seasons now, knew while filming the current eleventh installment last summer that it was something special — and she was right. The show is bringing the laughs, the tears and, of course, the drama on a level that it hasn’t in quite some time.For the latest episode of In The Know’s pop culture podcast, We Should Talk, Melissa Gorga opened up about filming the already-divisive season, including the feuds between herself and Jennifer Aydin and between sister-in-law Teresa Giudice and Jackie Goldschneider. She also opened up about airing out her marriage troubles with her husband, Joe Gorga, and looked back at her time on Bravo.“I’ve been on this show for a very long time, pretty much since the beginning. I know when we have seasons that the fans are going to go crazy over, and I know when we have seasons that are going to be decent, but not the holy cow,” Gorga told IJK. “This is one of those — this is a holy crap season. I haven’t seen this kind of season in a long time, to be honest. I knew it while we were filming it, and it also stressed me out, and that’s how I knew it. I haven’t felt stressed like this probably since season 4. There was a part of me that was like, ‘No...’ I actually froze for a minute in my head to say, ‘How are you going to handle this right now?’ Because she totally threw me off-guard. I know these are some of those rumors — there is plenty said about Housewives — but these are rumors that drive people crazy. So, I almost froze. I almost don’t react, if you pay attention. I am dumbfounded, and it’s very hard to get me like that. Usually, I’m quick on my feet, but I really couldn’t believe it. There are certain cast members we could do that to or that could happen to, but I know Jackie isn’t one of them. She’s not someone who can handle something like that, especially because it’s not true. I knew that could send Jackie down a very bad path.”Melissa Gorga on showing her marriage struggles this season: “For Joe and I, obviously you guys have seen the trailer, it’s a little different for me and I this year. It’s very real for us. It’s not that we were ever hiding anything before. I’ve shown throughout the years that, as I worked a little bit more, it stressed him out, and we were having small difficulties that we were working through. During COVID and also that time, we truly got to a level which I feel like every marriage has [with] its ups and downs — there’s always a year or two where you go through it — and the truth is that we were really going through it this summer, and we were filming. [...] I was at my wits end with him, and I think I let it show.”Melissa Gorga on her relationship with Jennifer Aydin: “What’s funny about Jennifer is that what she tends to come after me for, I’m never even looking her way. She’s like, ‘You gonna find a mirror? Do you love yourself today? We know you think you’re the queen.’ And I’m like, ‘I’m not even looking at you or speaking to you. I don’t care if you’re in the room or not. How ‘bout that?’ I want to like her, because she has this funny vibe that I want to like, and when she wants to be nice, she is so nice. But she cannot help herself to constantly say things. [...] I don’t know what she’s trying to say, but that is all her. I don’t even look her way when it comes to that. Sometimes she can be quirky and funny and most of the time she can’t read the room. She has no filter either, so I have this love/hate relationship with Jennifer.”Melissa Gorga on the RHONJ cast: “It’s an awesome cast, it really is. We all have something a little different. This cast isn’t afraid to speak up. It was always hard to cast Jersey because Teresa and I have been on for so long, and we’re a family. It’s very rough to mix people in for us, because it’s too strong of a situation. But they have all found their place. Everyone has found their spot, no one’s scared, everyone says what they feel, and that’s what I think is really important. Debuting in 2008 with The Real Housewives of Orange County, the franchise has evolved with multiple spinoffs. Millions of people tune in to watch these ladies tear each other apart every week. While there are many housewives in the franchise’s history, the ones on this list stand out even from their peers. Each of these powerful ladies etched their names in reality show history forever. Tiffany Hendra appeared in all but one season of The Real Housewives of Dallas. Fans got to see Hendra begin her fashion blog, Sanctuary of Style. Hendra was later demoted to a guest role for season two and season four. She’s also a mentor and coach for The Coaching Sanctuary, which offers services to help empower women. Hendra continues traveling the world with her musician husband, Aaron. Former model Kelly Bensimmon hopped on The Real Housewives of New York City in season two. At first, she couldn’t make friends with anyone because of her off-the-wall behavior. Among other behaviors, she was arrested for domestic violence against her ex-boyfriend. Following her exit after season four, Bensimmon returned as a guest in seasons six and seven. In 2015, she graduated from Northeastern University with an MBA. Since August 2019, she’s been working with the Douglas Elliman real estate group. Kelly Dodd joined The Real Housewives of Orange County in season 11. At the start, Dodd’s fiery behavior rubbed housewives Heather Dubrow and Shannon Beador the wrong way. When season 14 rolled around, she started fights with nearly everyone on the program. Ex-husband Michael Dodd and ex-boyfriend Jeff Caldwell both claimed Dodd assaulted them. Housewife Vicki Gunvalson also sued Dodd in November 2019 for defamation of character following her statements on the show. That same month, Dodd became engaged to Rick Leventhal. Lydia McLaughlin left The Real Housewives of Orange County as quickly as she came. Following season eight, the businesswoman exited the show. Three years later, though, she returned for season 11. McLaughlin permanently left the franchise at the end of the season for the security of her children. Outside of work, she runs her own lifestyle blog titled OC Lydia. In 2015, she released the book Beyond Orange County: A Housewives Guide to Faith and Happiness. As the wife of basketball icon Scottie Pippen, Larsa turned heads on season one of The Real Housewives of Miami. During her time on the show, she was joined by longtime friend Cristy Rice. In 2016, Scottie filed for divorce, but the couple still tried to work things out. Unfortunately, things didn’t change, and Larsa filed for divorce two years later. They agreed to share custody of their children. Alex McCord took over the airwaves during the first four seasons of The Real Housewives of New York City. One of her biggest feuds was with Jill Zarin, which escalated into a heated battle in season three. McCord wasn’t asked to return following season four. McCord recently celebrated 20 years together with him. “No one I would rather ride with on this train of life,” McCord said in an Instagram post. During season four, she engaged in a massive feud with Brandi Glanville. Following the season, Giraud was fired from the show. In 2014, she co-created the popular Estrella TV reality series Rica, Famosa, Latina, which was inspired by Real Housewives. She also made her return to acting with an appearance in 2017’s Jeepers Creepers 3 as Deputy Dana Lang. Peggy Sulahian had the honor of being the 100th housewife in the popular franchise. However, her time on The Real Housewives of Orange County only lasted one season. During season 12, she stunned her fellow housewives by revealing she had breast cancer. When it comes to a possible return to reality TV, she believes that chapter of her life is closed. “At this point, moving on seemed like the right thing to do,” she told US Weekly. She’s still married to business mogul Diko. Caroline Manzo made her presence felt during the first five seasons of The Real Housewives of New Jersey. The entrepreneur exited the show to begin her own spinoff titled Manzo’d with Children. Manzo was asked to return to Real Housewives for its 10th season, but she turned it down because it was a friend role. During her initial run, she landed a spinoff show with husband Kroy Biermann entitled Don’t Be Tardy. While Zolciak-Biermann left Atlanta after season five, she made guest appearances through season 10. The actress walked away from the show after one season, but she appeared as a guest in season eight. Edmonds exited the show following season 12, but she made a guest appearance in season 14. Keough would make guest appearances until officially departing the show after season 12. She currently sells rugs as part of her Jill Zarin Home brand. Zarin also works for the Little Nasties podcast, which spawned from the 2015 audiobook Tales from Beyond the Pale: Little Nasties. Daytime Emmy-winning soap opera star Eileen Davidson shocked fans by appearing on The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills. On the show, Davidson reunited with her former Days of Our Lives co-star Lisa Rinna. Most fans remember her for the infamous wine throwing moment with Brandi Glanville. Carlton Gebbia made a splash on The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills in season four. As the only practicing witch on the show, she was accused of casting spells on her castmates. She got a divorce from her husband David in September 2018 after 20 years together. In late 2017, she was sued by a former housekeeper for years of physical abuse. More recently, Gebbia made the jump to Miami. Alexis Bellino arrived on The Real Housewives of Orange County in season five. During the show, Bellino began a new career as a morning news correspondent. She originally quit after season seven, but she returned for season eight before leaving for good. In 2019, she starred in Marriage Boot Camp: Reality Stars. Danielle Staub’s time on The Real Housewives of New Jersey was littered with controversy. From her criminal past to lawsuits from her ex-husband Kevin Maher, Staub’s life was considered must-see-TV by most people. Staub exited the show after season two, but she returned in a supporting role for a few more seasons. Gretchen Rossi, a daytime Emmy-winning soap opera star in season four. During her time on the show, she aided her then-fiance Jeff’s fight with leukemia. Unfortunately, Jeff passed away during the season’s taping. Rossi met now-fiance Slade Smiley in the next season. Yolanda Hadid, who was married to producer David Foster, joined The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills in season three. During her stint, her battle with Lyme disease was a major topic. Taylor Armstrong delivered some memorable moments during the first three seasons of The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills. Off-screen, however, her personal life was filled with tragedy. After filing for divorce from her husband, she later found him dead. The aftermath of his death was on display during season three.
