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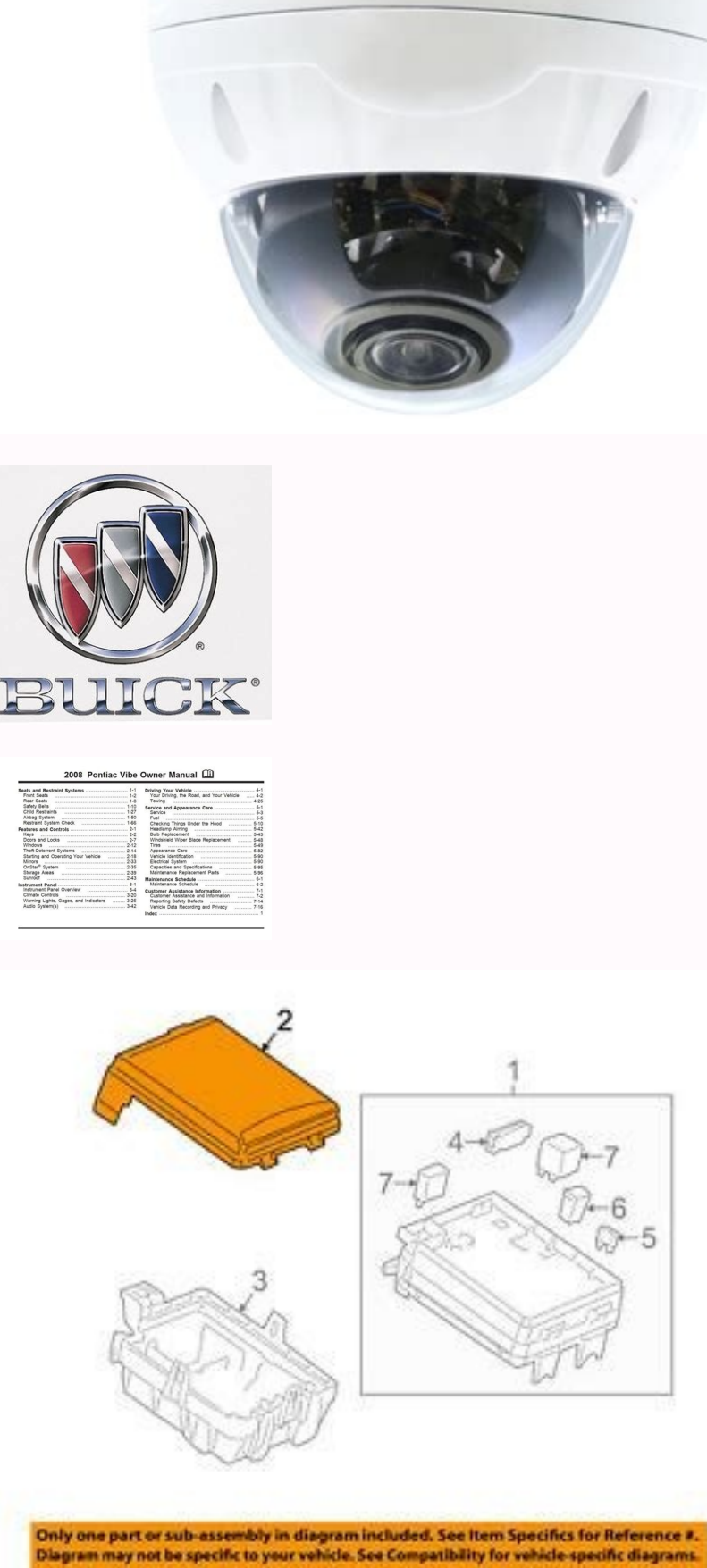

Initiated by the automotive pioneer David Dunbar Buick, was one of the first American marques of automobile, and was the company that established the General Motors in 1908. [2] Before the creation of General Motors, the founder of GM William C. Durant had served as a general administrator and Buick's main investor. For a large part of its existence in the North American market, Buick It was marketed as a brand of premium automobile, selling luxury vehicles positioned above the main GM brands, while below the Cadillac brand. Buick was the only GM brand to have a separate design studio, all models were designed in-house. Buick's technology, particularly its overhead valve engine, was a major factor in the success of its products. Buick's cars were known for their reliability, and the brand was the only GM brand to have a "straight-8" for all models to date. From 1931, the first Buick V8 was introduced in 1935, then in 1962, Buick V6 was introduced to a special compact model. Special Engines were used in few exceptions. Buick's cars were used over heated vehicles that the company pioneered in the 1950s. 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model lines, and although Centuryand Super both used the same engine as the top-line Roadmaster, only Roadmaster used 4 VentiPorts. Then it lit up on the rear wheel before leveling again in a straight run back to the rear light. The "Riviera trim", as it was initially called, was made available on the Roadmaster convertible very late in the'49 model year. On July 24, 2009, Grace Lieblein, GM's new president at MÃ©xico, revealed that the Buick brand would be available in MÃ©xico at the end of September of that year, after a year-long outage, with the LaCrosse and Enclave models. Buick shared the lease floor with Pontiac and GMC © the Pontiac brand disappeared in the summer of 2010. On Mar 26, 2019, Buick announced that the Mexican division will offer only crossovers (Encore, Envision and Enclave).
