Where as the Performance Style is the way in which the plot is conveyed in a peformance, sometimes to a particular philosophy of performances, or to an historical period. Now these are just some of the Theatrical Conventions which I've listed here, with definitions and examples :)FREEZE FRAMEA freeze frame is a frozen moment of a scene. During a performance the actor freezes action and sound at apremeditated time to enhance dramatic tension and/or to highlight an important moment in a scene. It can becompared to pressing 'pause' on a video at a signifi cant moment in the narrative.CARICATURECaricature is an exaggeration of a character that is often ludicrous or grotesque. It can be comic, at timesderogatory, and with the intention of ridiculePATHOSPathos is a state which evokes a feeling of pity or sadness in the audience, for example the power of stirringtender or melancholy emotion. Pathos may be associated with comedy and tragedySATIRESatire is the use of wit and comedy to attack, denounce or deride a target. Satire exposes or questions the presenceof vice, folly, abuse or pretence. It can be achieved through the manipulation of language, caricature, parody,parable or other comedic theatrical conventions. The satirist laughs at, punishes or questions a target and/or anaudience. The target may be an individual or a system.HEIGHTENED USE OF LANGUAGEHeightened use of language is poetic and exaggerated use of language. It includes the deliberate choice of wordswhose syntax, alliteration and rhyming patterns enhance the dramatic statement. Intended meaning is enhancedthrough the use of non-conventional and non-naturalistic dialogue.
