Here's a short video to further assist you. Attach the lower anchor attachments to the lower anchors found in your vehicle. Make sure that your car seat is positioned at the proper recline angle. If there's any confusion, watch this short video. Note You don't need to remove the harness to use your car seat in booster mode. To convert to booster mode, do the following Loosen the harness completely Release the harness buckle and unfasten the chest clip make sure that the harness straps are out of the way. Squeeze the ClickTight Release Levers and open the ClickTight. Unhook the Retaining clips located at the back of the seat cover. Pull the seat cover and foam insert forward and slide over the Easy Buckle Belly Pad. Lay the Buckle Pad forward and place it on top of the Harness Adjuster Release Lever. Put the seat cover and foam back in place and attach the retaining clips. Unhook the harness straps from the hip anchors. Pull the head restraint into the highest position. Remove the chest pads. Tuck the straps under the wing covers. Open the ClickTight refer to step 3. Unhook the retaining clips to pull the seat cover and foam forward. Pull the belly pad through the slot located in the seat cover. Place the seat cover and foam back in place and attach the retaining clips. Take the harness straps from behind the wing covers and attach them to the ClickTight anchors. Make sure the harness is connected to the top of the hip anchor. Close the ClickTight you should hear a click. Reattach the chest pads. Fasten the harness buckle and chest clip. As you can

see, there are a lot of steps. These videos will demonstrate, in detail, everything you just read. To buckle your child in a Britax convertible car seat you must Press the harness adjuster button to loosen the harness. Unfasten the buckle and chest clip. Attach the straps to the harness holders. Place the straps around your child and fasten the buckle. Make sure that the harness is at proper harness height. Pull the adjuster strap to tighten the straps pull until you hear a click. Make sure the harness is secure on your child you shouldn't be able to pinch any excess at the shoulder. Close the chest clip and position it at your child's armpit level. If you need more help, this video will walk through all of the steps listed above. Rearfacing Swedish Method To install a tether in the rearfacing position, complete the steps listed below. Make sure your vehicle has a proper anchor location, which must be a fixed vehicle anchor point that's bolted to the floor. Remove the versa tether from the back of the Britax car seat and disconnect the tether connector strap. Wrap the tether connector strap around the anchor point, and pull the metal clip through the loop of the connector strap. Lift the tab on the tether strap adjuster to pull the webbing far enough to attach to the connector strap. Latch the hook of the tether strap to the connector strap, and pull the slack from the tether strap. Don't tension. Store excess webbing in the pouch behind the seat. Here's a visual demonstration on how to attach a rearfacing tether. Remove the lower connectors from the storage slot, and pull the strap to full length. Repeat this process on the second strap. Remove the versa tether. Store the connector strap in the pouch behind the seat. Lift the adjuster tab and pull the strap in the direction of the tether hook. Store the tether strap in the seat to get it out of the way. Adjust the recline angle to the proper position, and place the seat in the forwardfacing position. Remove the headrest of the back seat if it interferes with the car seat's angle. Attach the lower connectors to the lower attachment anchors. Make sure the car seat is fastened securely. Attach the tether strap hook to the tether anchor location and remove slack. Don't tension.

Secure the excess webbing using the elastic band found on the tether strap. This video will help you if you need a visual aid on how to attach a forwardfacing tether. Sometimes, you may need to place something like a rolledup washcloth to set your car seat at the right angle. To begin Remove the lower connectors from the storage spots and pull the strap to full length by pressing the adjuster release button. Repeat this. Recline the car seat completely, and place it in the rearfacing position. Make sure the base is pressed evenly on your vehicle's seat. Connect the lower connectors to the lower attachment anchors. Make sure the car seat is fastened securely on the seat. Make sure the car is on level ground. The car seat should be angled at least 30 degrees from the vertical position and up to 45 degrees from the vertical position for infants. Use the blue line located on the base as a guide to properly set your car seat in the middle of the recommended recline angle. The blue line should be parallel to the ground. This video will further explain how to recline a Britax convertible car seat. If you choose the rearfacing position, make sure you adjust the straps at or below shoulder level. When using the forwardfacing position, adjust the straps so they're at or above shoulder level. Lift the harness adjuster lever and loosen the harness. Unhook the harness straps from the yoke at the back of the car seat. Pull one strap through the shell and cover. Pull the harness strap through the desired harness slot to the back of the car seat. Insert the right strap loop into the left strap loop and attach them completely to the yoke. This video will show you how to adjust the straps on a Britax convertible car seat. Pull and hold the release lever located on the back of the car seat. Lift the car seat from the base. There's not much more to it than that. It can get your child through the first 10 years of their life. As many parents can attest, if you don't have an all-in-one seat, you may end up having to purchase 3 car seats over the course of the first 10 years of your child's life. I love that the Britax One4Life could be your one and done. Like so many moms and dads, I've struggled with car seat installation from the very beginning. My number 1 priority as a mom is my kids' safety. I never truly felt that my kids' car seats were installed properly or safe enough, and of course, I never want to be in a situation where I find out. They taught me a lot of things about installing car seats specifically Britax that I think a lot of parents probably don't know; and therefore, their children's car seats may be installed incorrectly. Best Kept Car Seat Secrets 1. Positioning of the car seat straps on forward-facing vs. This is a big one, and I was so grateful to learn it. You may have to adjust the straps to fit your child. Learning lots from Miss Sarah, the Britax CPST! 2. Head positioning for rear and forward-facing car seats When REAR FACING, your child's head should be at least 1 inch below the top of the head rest. When FORWARD FACING, the top of your child's ears should be below the top of the head restraint. This is also something so many people don't think is important when it comes to the safety of the seats. But all of this positioning and strapping is part of how you keep your child safe. 3. ClickTight

Installation I always had trouble with LATCH installation on our previous car seats. I was never sure if it was tight enough or if it was at the correct angle. I am actually OBSESSED with the Britax ClickTight technology that ensures a safe installation, every single time. And it's so easy that even I can't mess it up. It uses the belt path in your car vs. LATCH, so it can be done in any car or airplane!, and you know it's in properly when you hear the click. I love knowing that the Britax One4Life allows me to know that I am safely installing my kids' carseats. This is definitely my favorite feature of the car seats. 4. Don't forget the top tether. For all forward facing car seats there is a top tether see picture above to connect in your car. In crossovers and SUVs, the tether is likely in the ceiling of your vehicle, and in sedans, it might be on the floor of the shelf above the seats. Nevertheless, if your child is in a forwardfacing convertible car seat, make sure you're using the top tether because I'll be the first to admit that there was a time that I didn't know it existed.

In the event of an accident Gd forbid!, the top tether really keeps the top of the car seat from moving forward at all. This is key to keeping your kids safe. 5. Positioning the chest clip!! ARMPIT LEVEL. I repeat, ARMPIT LEVEL. Not at their neck and not at their belly. ARMPIT, people. Stay safe! 6. Read the manual. This sounds obvious, but it's not. I never read manuals, but now I know that every car seat is different, so you HAVE to read the manual to know how to properly and safely install and use different car seats. Obviously, I'm now sold on the Britax One4Life, so I can finally say that I don't think I'll ever need another car seat again. Oh the glory! Miri is starting young by reading the manual. 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They also ensure that babies ride comfortably in the car until they have grown enough to be protected by a vehicles' seat belt system. We tested the Britax Marathon ClickTight Convertible Car Seat to see if it lived up to its reputation as the ultimate in safety and comfort. We also considered factors like installation, portability, ease of cleaning, and overall value. Read on for our insights. Either way, the Marathon ClickTight tethers attach to your car's LATCH system anchors. The user manual doesn't make that clear as Britax calls it ClickTight instead of LATCH, but it's still the same safety feature that connects the car seat to the physical frame of the car. This was pretty easy and left us with two hooks, one on each side of the car seat, that we then connected to the LATCH anchors in our vehicle. We used this car seat in our midsize SUV. The Britax Marathon ClickTight car seat hooks require a bit of maneuvering to connect to the car's anchors as they're shaped like carabiners. We had to get them hooked all the way around before they would engage, rather than just pushing down on an enclosed system with a guide sleeve. Using the same ClickTight feature, you lift up the seat, thread the strap through the appropriate channel in the seat, and buckle it into the vehicle's seat belt. While we personally prefer to attach the car seat to the vehicle's LATCH system, it's nice to have this additional option. It is also much easier to teach this ClickTight seat

belt method to someone who may not use a car seat frequently, such as a temporary babysitter or visiting relatives. The Britax Marathon ClickTight is considered one of the easiest car seats to install for this reason. In fact, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration NHTSA awarded Britax with a fivestar Ease of Use rating.

Instead of having to rethread the strap blindly through the car seat, we just lifted up the seat, turned the strap around, and were ready to reinstall the Britax Marathon ClickTight into the car. But if you do find yourself having to change the configuration constantly due to transporting different children each day, the ClickTight feature can make it much easier to know that you are doing so safely. It would be a great pick for a grandparent or childcare provider who may be taking care of children of different ages on a regular basis. Some parents prefer to purchase a rearfacing infant car seat that can be taken out of the car easily and used in a stroller travel system. At about 1 year old, however, your child will likely be pushing the weight or height limits of infant car seats and it'll be time to upgrade to a permanent convertible car seat. For this reason, some parents opt to buy a convertible car seat from the beginning. The rearfacing configuration is recommended for children from 5 to 40 pounds while the forwardfacing configuration can be used as early as 20 pounds. Just note that there may be state car seat laws that also provide guidance on when to switch your child. Always check the local laws to make sure that you are in compliance. If you aren't sure, most police and fire stations will do a free car seat inspection to make sure that it is safe. Like all other convertible car seats, it has a fivepoint harness to safely secure the child in the seat. It also offers multiple harness and buckle heights, allowing taller and smaller children to be equally comfortable in the same car seat. The ease of adjustability is part of what makes this a top car seat pick among parents. Our favorite design components, though, are the 14 different harness settings and seven recline positions. We used the Marathon ClickTight car seat in the rearfacing configuration for our 20monthold and in the forwardfacing configuration for our almost 3yearold.

Both were comfortable in the car seat with a few simple adjustments of the harness and we didn't need to remove pads or rethread it between uses. If you'll be using this car seat with multiple children, this can save a lot of time and frustration. While we could put our oldest in the third row, we prefer to have all of our children close as they're all still little and need a lot of attention. But finding a convertible car seat that can fit with two other car seats in a single row is a challenge. We were able to fit this car seat alongside another convertible car seat and an infant car seat in our back seat. This is a huge deal for our family and may be a necessity if you have three or more children in your vehicle. At 28.5 pounds, it's not the lightest model on the market, but again, as a convertible car seat, it's really designed to be kept in the car. We followed the detailed instructions and illustrations included in the user manual to remove the pads for washing. They are not machinewashable but were easy to wash in the sink using a mild detergent and cold water. The harness can be removed as well, but we found it was easier to clean it while it was still installed in the car seat shell. We wiped out stray crumbs and stickiness with a wet washcloth. From the patented ClickTight installation system to the actual frame and materials of the seat, it is obvious that safety is Britax's number one priority. Essentially, the base is full of red plastic SafeCell pieces which, in the event of a collision, crumble to make sure your child isn't rattled. These aren't features that affect everyday use, but they do make the Britax Marathon ClickTight one of the safest convertible car seats out there. Cheaper car seats don't come with a steel frame, sideimpact protection, or many of the other design features that set this car seat apart. If you're able to spend the extra money, it can provide additional peace of mind which is priceless.

There's no LATCH system installation or adjustable harness and recline. While it's not our top pick for everyday use, it is a great option if you want a second car seat that won't break the bank. The pads are also machinewashable, which we love. If you want an option that will take you from birth to booster seat while still providing comfort and safety, this is our car seat of choice. All other features

are the same as the Marathon ClickTight, with the addition of a second layer of side impact protection. Because rearfacing mode is used for babies from birth through a maximum of 40 pounds, it may provide valuable peace of mind to you to know that your youngest is protected. This plush, longlasting car seat does many things though not at the same time! it rear faces, forward faces, then converts to a high back booster seat. In all modes, the installation or setup is pretty darn simple, which means that it's easier to install and use correctly. In addition to the ClickTight installation, the One4Life is packed with thoughtful details — sleek styling, a smooth shell, and bright, easytoread information labels.

There's even a helpful handle at the top of the seat to make removing the seat from the box simple. All of this adds up to a pretty appealing option, come along as we take a closer look. This system includes an easytoopen panel and some clearly marked belt paths — blue for rear facing and green for forward facing. Just open the panel, thread the vehicle seat belt through the exposed belt path, remove most of the slack from the belt, then close the panel. Don't forget the top tether for forward facing installations. In most cases, this rather simple set of instructions makes for a secure install. That ease of use is why we're such fans of the ClickTight installation system. Harness Webbing Britax One4Life with diamond weave harness The One4Life has a new type of harness webbing with a diamondweave pattern.

Britax let us know that this new pattern is stronger than traditional types of webbing. I found that this texture had a bonus feature — it was just a bit harder for a kiddo to move the chest clip around and the harness was less likely to twist. Headrest Adjustment Britax One4Life 15 position adjustable headrest The headrest has 15 positions for a proper harness fit at every stage. It adjusts with a squeeze of the red button at the top of the headrest. Because it has all of those harness positions, Britax has modified the rules around headrest placement a bit — in rear facing mode, the harness must be at the nearest position below the child's shoulders, in forward facing mode, the harness must be at the nearest position above the child's shoulders. Infant Insert Britax One4Life insert limits This insert very clearly states that it is for use with children who weigh less than 20 pounds. This sounds like a small thing — printing an insert's height and weight limits on the insert itself — but we find time after time that caregivers don't refer to the manual for this kind of information and end up using the inserts way too long. Having such large numerals right there on the insert will no doubt help caregivers know when to remove the insert as their child grows. Headrest Cover Britax

One4Life cover folded up The headrest cover must also be unfolded when the seat is used for children who weigh more than 20 pounds. That's a little hard to explain, hopefully our photo says it best. Britax One4Life Cover Adjustment The inside of the cover has some thoughtfully placed velcro squares that keep the cover in place when the headrest is folded. That velcro clearly indicates where the cover should sit. Cupholders Britax One4Life cupholder The seat includes two cupholders — one for each side of the car seat. They're removable for cleaning. I appreciated being able to take a cupholder right off the seat to toss out my kiddo's uneaten goldfish crackers.

The fact that they're dishwasher safe is a bonus. Recline Positions The seat has 9 recline positions. They're numbered 1-8 for the rear and forward facing harness modes, and B for booster mode. The recline mechanism is easy to adjust — just press one of the buttons on either side of the car seat and move the shell to the desired position. The positions are labelled using white on red, and the black base has a small window that shows which recline position the seat is in. We found this design is very easy to read, so we give it an enthusiastic thumbs up. Color Coded Recline Angle Guide Britax One4Life recline indicator The One4Life's recline angle indicator is quite easy to read. There's an indicator on both sides of the seat so it's always visible. In addition, there's a large, comprehensive label with a guide to the proper recline angles on the side of the seat near the indicator so it's easy to determine if the seat is installed at the right angle for your kiddo. Note the booster mode position is labelled "B," and the recline angles are numbered. I found that this part made the harness pads sit up really high on my models, right on the sides of their necks, but no one complained about the placement. The crotch buckle flips forward when the child isn't in this seat so it's out of the way when the child is loaded into the seat. Removable cover — the Drift fabric on our review seat is one of the options in the SafeWash line of fabrics. The only One4Life fashion that is not outfitted with a SafeWash cover is Black Diamond. Energy Management The One4Life includes a steel frame, EPS foam, and SafeCell technology. While none of these features are required as part of the FVMSS213 federal safety standard, Britax has a long history of working to exceed those requirements in as many ways as possible. SafeCell is the red honeycomblike plastic on the sides of the seat. It is designed to act as a crumple zone during a crash.
